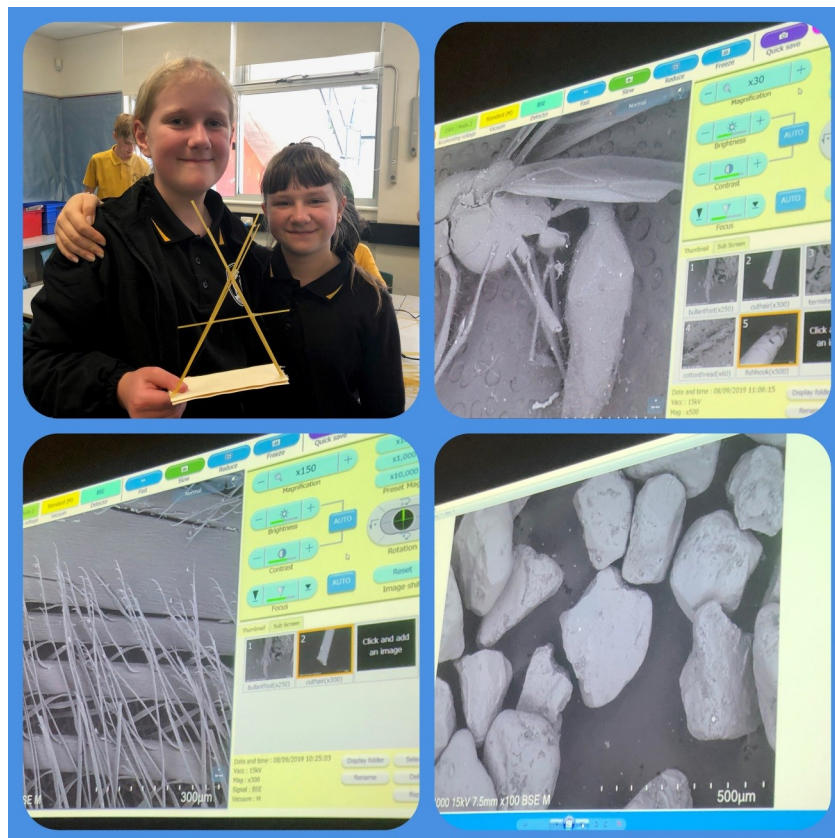

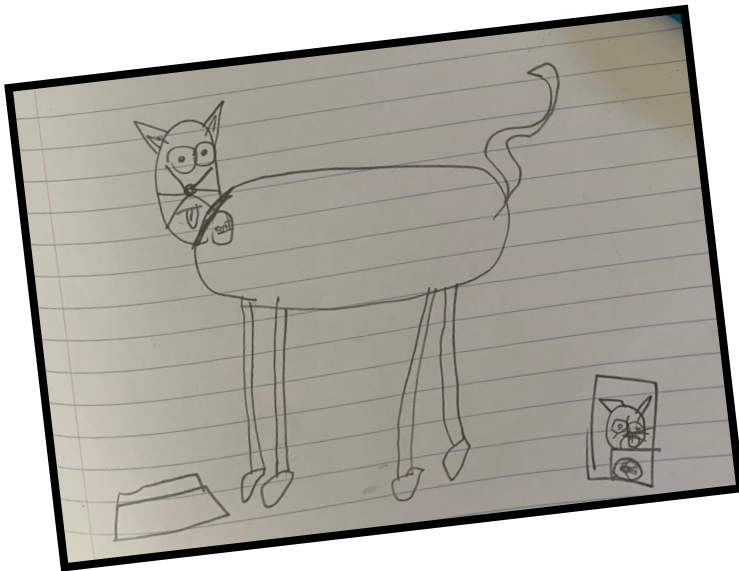

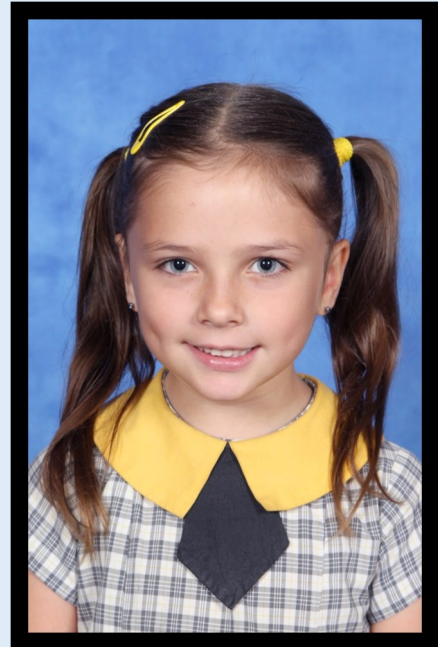

## FROM LITTLE THINGS, BIG THINGS GROW

This term Year 1 have been studying 'Watch it Grow' in Science. Mr Keegan, Mr Golding and Mrs Montgomerie brainstormed on 'what things grow' and the students were then introduced to lifecycles.

The students sang 'parts of a plant' and learnt that plants begin their life by a seed. Students were able to then label parts of a plant and make their own lifecycle of a plant in their science books. Next, we asked students what plants needed to grow and they came up with some very *interesting* facts. The most common answers; 'water, sun/light, soil.' We discovered why these nutrients were so important for plants to grow and decided to grow our own plants from a seed. The students were *very* excited. We decided to use grass seeds as they begin to show results quickly to keep the students engaged in the recording process. So, the students each put their soil and seeds in a cup and watered them. Now the waiting begins, the students have been eagerly watching their cups the last couple of days and will begin writing changes that appear during future science lessons.

It has been a very exciting and engaging unit so far and I am very excited to see the students results and findings.

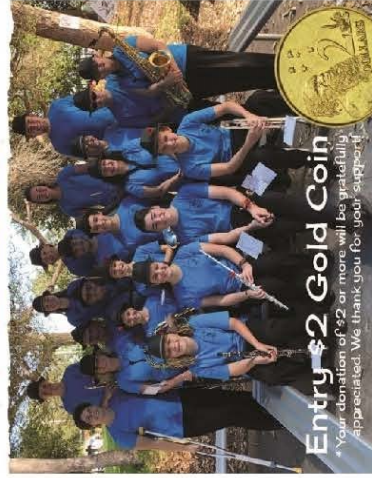

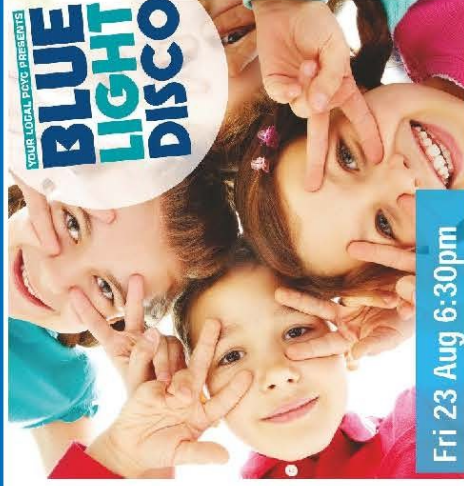
