SAFETY ON WHEELS - WHAT THE LAW SAYS

Bicycle riders, just as other road users, must comply with all NSW road rules. For more information about cycling laws, visit: <u>roadsafety.transport.nsw.gov.au</u> (staying safe).

Helmets

All riders and passengers on bicycles must wear an Australian and New Zealand Standards (AS/NZS 2063) approved helmet that is securely fitted and fastened on the rider's head.

Riding on the footpath or shared path

Unless there are signs that specifically prohibit them, bicycles may be ridden on the footpath by:

- Children under the age of 16
- Adults supervising a child under the age of 16
- Children 16 years and older with an adult accompanying another child under the age of 16.

All bicycle riders may ride on a shared path.

When riding on a footpath or shared path, riders must keep left, overtake on the right and give way to pedestrians.

As some readers would be aware, Tuncurry Public School has a life-size fibreglass cow residing on-site. Classes 3H and 3-2C entered into the Australian Dairy Picasso Cows Program and the judging was recently announced. We did not win but did receive a 'Special Mention Award' and will receive a \$250 voucher. Following are some of the comments from the judging:



The calibre of work produced by the students from Tuncurry Public School whilst learning about dairy farms, how cows make milk and understanding how milk is produced and brought to us, in addition to designing and decorating "Mrs Milky Moojoy" delighted the judges.

The Learning Journal compiled by the teacher highlights the school's learning journey and uses good presentation techniques that include creative photography, reflections and student work samples. It is delightful to see how the cow was embraced by all involved.

The work samples provided evidence about how the Picasso Cow Program educated and engaged the students about cow breeds, cows and their calves, dairy farmers and dairy farms, and the many things and people that are involved in producing milk and other dairy products.

There is no doubt that students experienced a high degree of enjoyment and that their engagement in learning was significantly enhanced by participating in the Picasso Cows Program.
